General Information

Water Skiing, Bicycle Rental, & Ice Service:

\$15.00 per ski ride (approximately 10 min). Lessons are available upon request (\$85/hour). Bike rentals - \$10/day, or \$50/week. Ice is available following all meals from the Dining Hall - complimentary, all sizes. Services are billable to family accounts.

Guest Meals:

Only registered Family Campers are allowed in the Camp Nicolet Dining Hall. However, vaccinated guests may join your family for a meal. \$10/breakfast, \$10/lunch, \$15/dinner. Please pay the Kitchen Manager or Staff Member on duty by check to Camp Nicolet, Inc.

Please Note - 2022 Registration and Check-in Policy:

1. There is a **\$300 non-refundable deposit** to hold your cabin. Current families have priority for their same cabin for one month after registration opens. If camp hasn't received a deposit from your family within 30 days of registration opening, then the cabin becomes available to other families. Currently there is a small wait-list of new families and Camp Nicolet alumni hoping to attend in 2022.
2. Deposits are accepted via USPS with the paper registration form, or we accept credit cards via PayPal. If paying the deposit online, please be sure to **scan and e-mail** your Registration Form. PayPal instructions are here: <http://campnicolet.com/family-camp/>
3. Cabin changes are permitted after we've heard from present families, following the 30-day "priority window," and we evaluate cabin availability. Please contact us directly if you are interested in changing your cabin.
4. Upon arriving at camp, we will ask that you **check in at the office and pay for your stay in full** prior to going to your cabin and unpacking. By doing this, the financial aspect will be out of the way for the time you are with us. You will also know the final number of people in your group at that time. There are **no refunds** for late arrival / early departure.
5. Upon arrival, you are asked to turn in a COVID-19 self-screening form. These are available for download on the Family Camp page of the camp website. The forms are completed by **each camper** no less than 72 hours prior to arrival. Guests are also screened by a member of the Camp Nicolet Health Staff or Leadership Team on arrival.
6. Upon departure, **please check out at Camp Office**. Any charges incurred during your stay for additional guests, guest meals (not paid at the Dining Hall), camp store (Canteen), water skiing, or bicycle rental are settled at this time. Thank you in advance!

Guidelines at *Camp Nicolet - Cabin Rental & Family Camp*

Welcome to Camp Nicolet! To provide an enjoyable and rewarding stay with us, it is essential that safety and communication are our main considerations. We ask your cooperation in making this "quality time".

Smoking: is prohibited in all camp buildings. When smoking outside, please extinguish all smoking materials in a safe manner and dispose of butts in the provided receptacles (not on the ground or in the lake, please!)

Firearms, weapons, and explosives (including fireworks): are not permitted on the camp premises. Gasoline or other flammable materials must be clearly marked and kept away from the cabin areas.

Alcohol and illegal drugs: the use of illegal drugs is prohibited on the camp premises. The use of alcohol is determined by the individual user groups and in accordance with Wisconsin State laws. Please be safe & responsible.

Groundfires: are not permitted for cooking purposes. A specific campfire area is available for your use in the Council Ring. No beach fires please!

Vehicles: the speed limit through the camp premises is a maximum of 15 MPH. Please keep all traffic to a minimum and use extreme caution because of small children, etc. Do not "pull up" to your cabin for any reason; underground utilities run between each cabin and can be easily damaged.

Parking: A parking lot is available on the "back road" of camp. Overflow parking at the discretion of the Camp Owners & Facilities Manager is also available. We ask you do not park by your cabin, but keep your vehicle in the designated lot. All camp roads must be kept clear at all times for emergency purposes.

Toilets: our toilets are our friends - please treat them accordingly! Camp operates on its own septic system which can be sensitive. Do not flush anything other than toilet paper.

Cabins: cabins are available to assigned participants (refer to registration information). Please turn off lights and close doors when leaving. Please do not write on the walls, bunks, etc. and leave your cabin as clean as you found it. Extra bathroom supplies, cleaning products, light bulbs, etc. are obtained at the Camp Office.

Firewood: Wood is provided in your cabin woodbox. Please do not cut down branches or trees for firewood or peel birch bark from live trees. The red metal fire bucket outside your cabin is for cleaning ashes from your fireplace – please do not deposit any flammable items in them or dispose of ashes in any other way.

Showers: the main camp Shower House is for your use and showers may be taken at any time, when the building isn't being cleaned. Please turn off the water, turn off the lights, and leave the door open when you are finished. Shower clogs, Crocs, etc. are recommended - no glass containers in the showers, please.

Personal Equipment/Possessions: Camp Nicolet does not assume responsibility for any personal equipment or possessions (including animals - none allowed) that you bring or loan to others. This includes theft, injury to yourself or others, and/or damage to these belongings. Personal items must be used responsibly following camp guidelines.

No Pets Policy:

Because of liability, general sanitation and consideration of others, family pets are not permitted on the camp premises.

Recycling: receptacles for recycling are placed around the camp grounds. Please use these when disposing of aluminum cans, plastic bottles, etc.

Bikes, In-line Skates, Longboards, etc.: we ask that there is no bike riding or skating on the camp sidewalks or tennis courts. Please have respect for older campers and small children – parents, please monitor this! We have miles of trails, camp roads, and excellent pavement within minutes of camp - ask for recommendations.

Swimming: Camp Nicolet, Inc. is not responsible for any swimming activity. If you wish to swim, the activity is at your own risk and we highly recommend the following guidelines:

- a certified lifeguard (with CPR/1st Aid certification including training in bloodborne pathogens) be on duty during all swim and boating times
- always maintain a 1:6 adult to child ratio
- never swim alone, always use the "buddy system"
- swim only in the designated swimming area
- no distance swimming outside of designated swimming area
- no running or horseplay around the water or on the docks
- no swimming after dark
- no skinny dipping (swimming nude)
- no "lake baths" with soap or shampoo

Boating Activities: it is mandatory that lifejackets (PFDs) be worn by all persons while participating in boating, canoeing, kayaking, boardsailing, or sailing activities. An equipment checkout list is posted in the boathouse. Please follow posted safety regulations and "rules of the road". No personal watercraft, like jet skis or Sea Doos, are allowed at camp. All equipment must be properly cleaned, dried, and put away when you are finished for the day.

Recreational Facilities: Forest Lodge is available for recreational enjoyment. A kitchenette with a refrigerator, ping pong table, piano, and large fireplace are available. Please respect the equipment and keep the Lodge clean!

Tennis courts are available for your enjoyment! Please wear tennis shoes only on the courts. No bikes, boards, or skates are allowed on the courts.

Repairs/Maintenance: if you notice anything needing repair or that should be brought to our attention, please report this to the Camp Nicolet owners. Part-time maintenance staff is on call throughout the week.

Unauthorized Persons:

If someone who is not a part of your group is present on site, please inform the camp office and/or the owners immediately. The person may be politely approached by at least two adults and directed to the camp office or the appropriate camp personnel. Camp Nicolet property boundaries encompass the stable area to the west and extend to Nicolet Village on the eastern shore. As we are surrounded by forest or water, parents/adults are responsible for their children and all family members at all times.

Emergency: phones are located in the camp office, and the owners' private homes. Emergency numbers are as follows:

Ambulance (Eagle River Memorial Hospital): **911**

Fire (Hiles North): **911** - our camp bell is rung 10 or more times to signal a fire or other emergency

User groups must notify camp personnel when emergency situations such as serious injury, lost or missing persons, or fire occur. Although camp personnel is trained in CPR/1st Aid, user groups are advised to have a group member with these certifications on site. Groups are responsible for providing their own First Aid care, supplies, and equipment and arrangements for emergency transportation. An AED is centrally located on the ground floor of the boathouse along with a First Aid kit.
